The Third Sunday of Advent is also known as *Gaudete* Sunday

The word “*gaudete*” is derived from the Latin words “*gaudium*,” joy, and “*gaudeo*,” to rejoice or be glad. *Gaudete* Sunday occurs eight to thirteen days before Christmas, and the nearness of the feast of Christmas is reason for great joy.

Reasons for Joy. There is joy in looking forward to the annual celebration of Christmas, but there is also joy in recalling the birth of Jesus on the first Christmas. The joy is heightened because Jesus was born to save us all.

A Joyful Colour. Rose represents joy and may be used as the liturgical colour for *Gaudete* Sunday. Violet remains the official colour for the Season of Advent, the Third Sunday included, because all of Advent has a penitential tone, a time for forgiveness and to be absolved of our failings and be in the state of grace for Christmas. *Gaudete* Sunday offers a brief respite to focus on the uplifting, upcoming joyful celebration of the Nativity. **What colour candle in our Advent wreath will be lit this weekend?**

In the Gospel of St Luke, we hear John the Baptist say that someone is coming who is more powerful than him, and that he will baptise us with the Holy Spirit. This really is good news and a reason to be joyous?
