Explanation of Parish Finances

The following money stays within the parish and covers the day to day running of the church

including utility bills, insurance, repairs and maintenance, wages, stationary, altar supplies etc.

The Parish Offering Envelope, the Standing Orders, the money from Shrines and any Donations.

Without these funds we would not be able to continue to run the parish.

The following money goes directly to the Archdiocese and is not part of parish funds.

The First Collection at Mass. This money goes to a diocesan central fund and pays all the priests of

the diocese.

The Second Collection at Mass (known as the "Share" collection) This money also goes to the

diocese to fund the diocesan administration of all services which oversees 199 parishes in the

diocese of Dublin.

This share collection is replaced by 7 special collections during the year for organisations such as

Crosscare, St Vincent De Paul, etc

The Christmas, Easter and Summer Dues also go to the Diocesan common fund to pay the priests of

the diocese, the dues do not stay in the parish.

The Tap and donate machine are an extension of the Sunday Mass collections and the money also

goes to the diocese.

As you can see, the Parish Offering envelopes, standing orders and shrine offerings are the only

money the parish receives. We thank most sincerely those who contribute to the parish through

these offerings. (Finance Committee)
