31st Week In Ordinary Time



Our Gospel reading this week is from St Luke. Chapter 19:1-10.

It tells the story of Zacchaeus (the chief tax collector). It is only found in Luke's Gospel. Because Zacchaeus, was small in height, he climbed a tree so he could see Jesus among the crowd. He must have been curious about what he was saying and doing, or maybe keeping his distance because many in the crowd would have had no time for him because of what he did for a living. But Jesus as we know challenged the status quo. Jesus respected women, he cared for the poor, and he shared meals with those regarded as sinners. **The message of the Gospel is that God is seeking through Jesus, those who are lost.** By a willingness to have a relationship with Jesus through prayer, we are opening ourselves to being changed by that ongoing relationship. At times we all struggle and can be lost in terms of understanding the meaning of our lives. It is only in a personal encounter with Jesus that our faith and calling can make any sense.

What does the sentence mean for you? **For the Son of Man came to seek out and to save the lost.**



Luke, we believe was a physician, and an historian and an artist too. Most scholars believe Luke was a companion of St Paul (Col 4:14; 2 Tim 4:11) and a disciple of the apostles. He also wrote the book of Acts. Most scholars also think the Gospel was written in the 80s, a generation after Jesus' first followers.


