Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Times



Our Gospel reading is from Matthew Chapter. 16:13-20.

Jesus asks his disciples, but who do you say that I am? The story of Jesus asking his disciples, who is he for them? and the response of Peter, is found in all three synoptic gospels, in Mark 8:13-20, and Luke 9:18-21. So, it was clearly an important message for the early Christian Church. Jesus is asking for more than an opinion from his followers, he wants to know their attitude to him, ultimately Jesus wants his followers to make the radical choice to follow him, because he can give meaning to existence. Jesus will always be a puzzlement for us and in some ways the better we know him, the more we will discover how little we know. By being open to a relationship with him, and being committed to his way of living, will challenge us to have a passion for justice and a tenderness for others, as he had. The real question is not just who Jesus is for us, but it is about ourselves and what do I believe and how do I live my life. While understanding our faith and coming to worship God each week is important, the real challenge is to put Jesus as God, at the centre of our lives. Who is Jesus for us and are we willing to being open to having a life changing relationship with him, by being open to his energy, his tenderness, and his spirit?
