Our Gospel reading is from St Matthew CH. 17: 1-9. The Transfiguration of Jesus.



The story of the transfiguration is also found in Mark 9:2-8, and Luke 9:28-36. The message highlights that Jesus more than Moses or Elijah, is of ultimate significance in God's plan for all of humanity. In this story Peter finally understands the significance of Jesus. Peter, James, and his brother John were terrified when they heard the voice of God. But as so often when he healed the sick, Jesus touched them and told them not to be afraid.

Today many of us are afraid to really listen to Jesus's message and to put him at the centre of our lives. We keep busy, with anything but being silent and open to God's loving presence. But it is Jesus who can give us a sense of meaning in our lives and free us from our anxieties, but only if we are open to his touch and we are willing to let ourselves be transformed by him.

We too, like James, John and Peter need to hear the evangelical call, 'this is my SON, the beloved, with him I am well pleased, listen to him.'

Can you stop, be silent and listen to God, revealed in Jesus? This inner listening can help us to live in the truth, to taste rather than waste life. By listening to God, we can discover the greatness that comes from being infinitely loved by God.
