Twenty Eight - Sunday in Ordinary Times

Our Gospel reading is from Matthew Chapter. 22:1-14.

The Gospel reading is also found in Luke's Gospel Chapter 14:15-24, with some differences, because in the case of Matthew's Gospel it was addressing some challenges for the early Christian community that it was written for at that time in about 85A.D. But we can still get some sense of the types of images used by Jesus, and how he would have communicated to the people he spoke to. The image of a wedding banquet would have been so appealing even as it is today. Peasant farmers had a tough life in Jesus' time, so an invitation (on the sabbath a day which was the one free day from work) to a banquet where they would sit with their neighbours to celebrate a wedding feast would have generated much excitement. We know from our Gospels that Jesus liked to sit at tables with everyone, eating with the so-called sinners and undesirable, because he wanted them to get a sense of what God was doing. Everyone is invited to be part of the Kingdom of God, a Kingdom of love and God is preparing a final feast for all his people and wants to have them sitting with him around a table, enjoying life forever, full of happiness. Even though many people are too busy, are not interested in religion or practicing their faith, God's invitation remains and can still be experienced if we take time to listen in silence.

What do these words mean for you? 'Go therefore into the main streets and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet'.


