Church of the Holy Spirit Ballyroan

22nd of October 2023 Twenty Ninth - Sunday in Ordinary Times

Our Gospel reading is from Matthew Chapter. 22:15-21.

The Gospel reading describes how the Jewish religious leaders have set a trap for Jesus, by asking him is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor? If he says no, they can accuse him of rebelling against Rome, if he says yes, he could be discredited in the eyes of his followers who are fed up with all the taxes to be paid. Jesus responds by asking to see a coin that is used to pay the tax. Interestingly, Jesus did not possess money of his own, and as a wandering preacher, neither did he have land or a home. The answer he gives is that people should give to the emperor the things that belong to the emperor and to God the things that belong to God. Jesus is not drawing a line between politics and religion; he does see God and Caesar as two separate powers that can justify what they demand from the people. All that is created belongs to God, Jesus' priority is life not religion, Jesus cares about everyone, particularly the poor and his message is that we all belong to God. While there may be two parallel authorities, dividing people's loyalty, God is above any emperor. There is relevance for us today, despite what those with influence or who have leadership roles in our society dictate, as people of faith we must resist any power that might try to limit our conscience or freedom to live out the Gospel message. While our Christian faith is not identified with any partisan political group, this does not mean that our faith should be relegated to a private arena. As Jesus challenged the leaders of his day, we too need to stand up for the values that defend the poor, the vulnerable and the dehumanization of any person or group.

What do these words mean for you? 'Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God that things that are God's'.


