Firstly, we are told that he had real authority, his teaching made a deep impression on those who heard him, as he differed from their own teachers referred to as Scribes. Secondly, he had power over evil, and he was able to heal. In our world we can see the results of those who act in an evil way causing suffering to many. We can see leaders who do not act with integrity and only wish to be popular. Jesus is our role model of a leader, who always spoke the truth, irrespective of how popular this might be and the ultimate cost to him in terms of his life.

While we are limited in what we can do, as we have no power over evil, we can pray that evil will be destroyed by the power of God.

Can we try to live like Jesus did and act with integrity in our lives and be honest in what we say and do?
