1st Sunday of Advent (Year C)



ADVENT IS A TIME OF EXPECTATION AND PREPARATION FOR THE BIRTH OF THE LORD.

The word Advent comes from the Latin word “adventus” or “coming”.

Advent emphasizes both the celebration of Christ coming into the world as a man and the second coming when the Lord will return.

Most Sundays during Advent Sundays we will hear a passage from the Gospel of Luke. Luke is many people’s favourite gospel. There is particular attention paid to the work of the Holy Spirit, women characters figure largely, Jesus tells lots of parables, and it even has a sequel – the Acts of the Apostles! Luke is also filled with stories of healing, people bursting into song, and resurrection stories such as the Road to Emmaus.

The Gospel of Luke written in the mid 80’s about 50 years after the death and resurrection of Jesus. It is the longest of all four has been described as the most beautiful book in the world, **Imagine a Christmas without** the story of the shepherds or a baby in a manger?

Luke, we believe was a physician, and an historian and an artist too. Most scholars believe Luke was a companion of St Paul (Col 4:14; 2 Tim 4:11) and a disciple of the apostles. Luke was a gifted writer and the first two chapters in Luke are repeatedly interrupted by poetry and hymns.

The Latin names to these hymns that you will be familiar with and are now very special prayers that we recite often.

Hymns: Ave Maria (the Hail Mary) (1:42-45) :
Magnificat (1:46-55) : Benedictus (1:67-79) :
Gloria in Excelsis (2:14) : Nunc Dimittis (2:29-32)

The Nunc Dimittis, also called the **Song of Simeon**, in the New Testament, a brief hymn of praise sung by the aged Simeon, who had been promised by the Holy Spirit that he would not die until he had seen the Messiah. Simeon was at the Temple in Jerusalem when Mary and Joseph came to present the infant Jesus for the rite of purification according to Jewish law and custom. Simeon recognized the baby as the promised Saviour, took him in his arms, and raised his hymn of praise.

Dear Parishioners,
