



Meditation on the Gospel

Our Gospel reading this week is from St Luke. Chapter 13:22-30. Luke continues the theme about discipleship, and how we must remain committed to living out our faith.

What do the following words mean for you?

'Indeed, some who are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last...'

As you know the Gospel stories, because they come from the ancient world that was mostly oral, use a form of exaggeration to make the point. Luke using all the sources he has, highlights that people need to avoid becoming complacent regarding their faith. While we do not want to live in fear of God, we still need to be engaged in living out our faith, making time for God in prayer and in loving and supporting others, particularly the most vulnerable.
